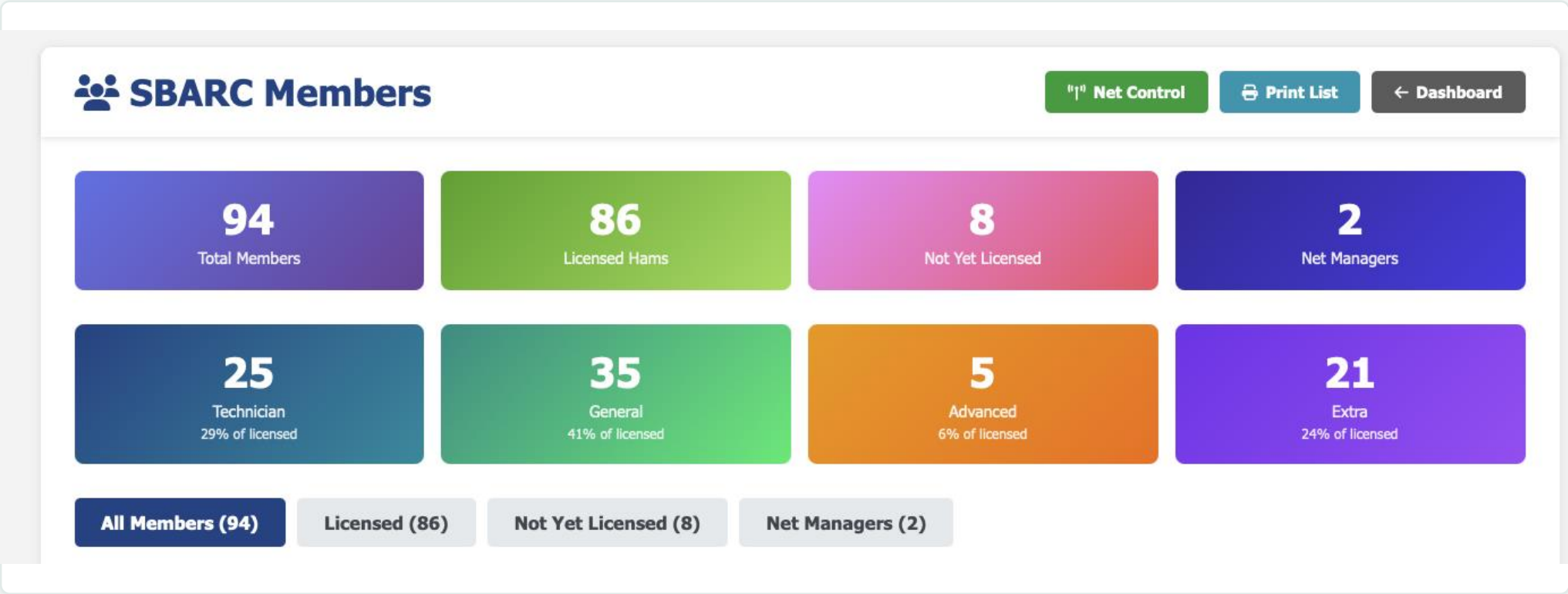
Net gain for the entire year

The \$10,000 held in US Treasury T-Bills works like an endowment — its ~\$350/year in interest covers most of our insurance and government fees, on its own.

Bank balance grew from \$2,130 (start of 2024) to \$2,938 (end of 2025) in checking + savings — a thin cushion for a club that also funds education and outreach programs.

94 Members — But Who's Funding Us?

To date, only \$520 has been donated in cash — from fewer than 5 of our 94 members.

Our biggest funding source — 70% of receipts — is unpredictable, and it's softened.

Good works get squeezed first

Fewer textbooks for our Technician class students. Less for STEM donations to the San Bruno Library.

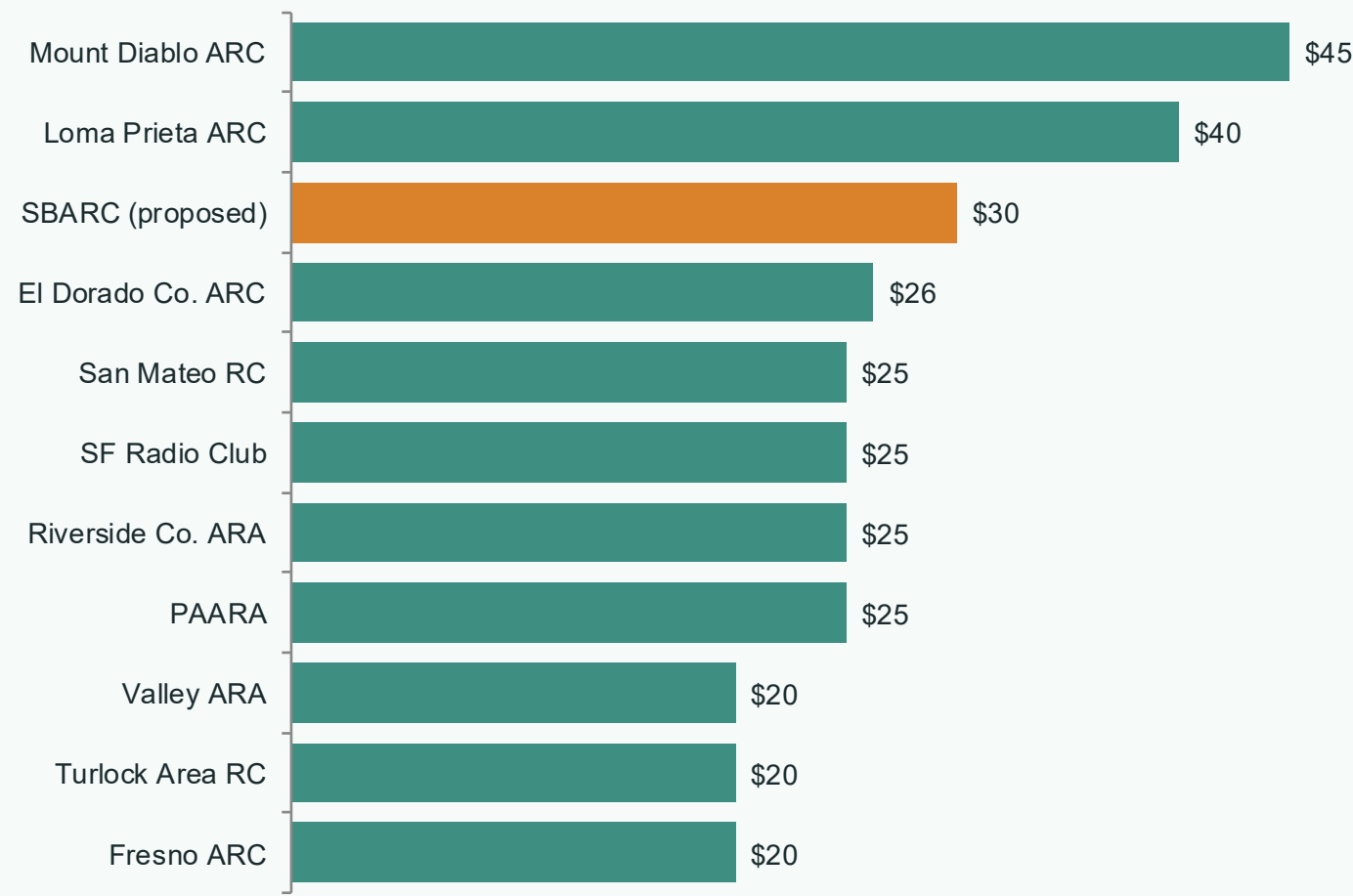

New tools have no budget line

AI subscriptions, our website, and Mailchimp are being paid for by individual members — or skipped — because there's nowhere for them in the budget.

Article IV — Dues

How the club may levy and enforce dues

	Current	Proposed
Non-payment consequence	May cause expulsion from the club (Board discretion)	Membership may be discontinued (Board discretion)
New-member grace period	Join in October or later → credited for the entire next year	Join in July or later → credited for the entire next year
Membership year	January 1 – December 31	October 1 – September 30
Delinquent after	March 1	December 1

Note: the draft bylaws text says “September 31,” which doesn't exist as a date — flag for correction to September 30 before the vote.

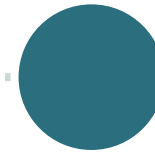

How signing up, running, and logging a net works today — and why it's worth showing off.



From Sign-Up to Archived Log

1

Sign Up

Claim an open Monday right from the Member Area's Net Control card.

2

Start the Net

Opening the log stamps who's running it, and when — no ambiguity later.

3

Check In

Regulars are pre-populated — net control just taps a box instead of typing. Visitors get added in seconds.

4

Fix Mistakes

Any check-in can be pulled back with one click, any time before the net closes.

5

Submit & Archive

Closing the net locks in open/close times and produces a clean, printable log automatically.

4. Closing the net produces a clean, archived record

Why It Matters

Faster, more accurate check-ins

Regulars are pre-populated, so net control taps a box instead of typing — fewer typos, faster nets.

Built-in error correction

Every check-in can be removed before the log closes, so a misclick never becomes the permanent record.

A record that keeps itself

Open/close times and the full check-in list are captured automatically — no post-net paperwork.

Data the club can act on

Feeds directly into our participation and net-control-points reports, so we can see who's showing up — and who to recruit.

It also builds the documentation ARES and Special Service Club status calls for — traffic handled, frequencies used, and participation, on record automatically.

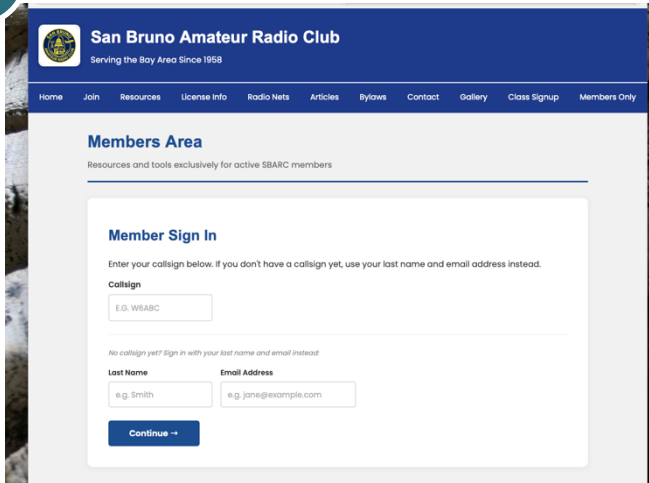

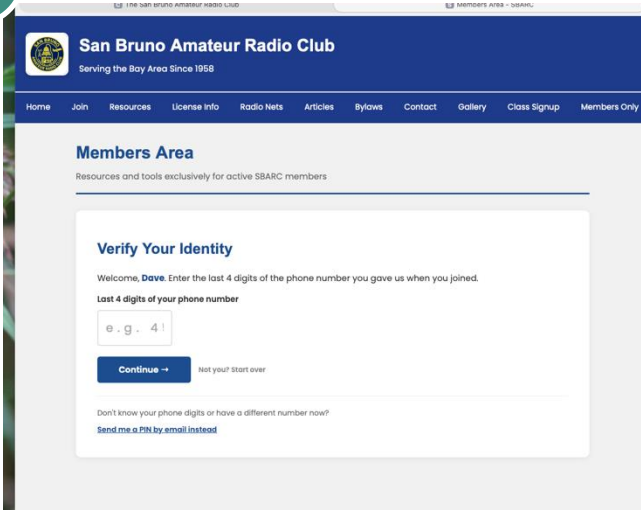

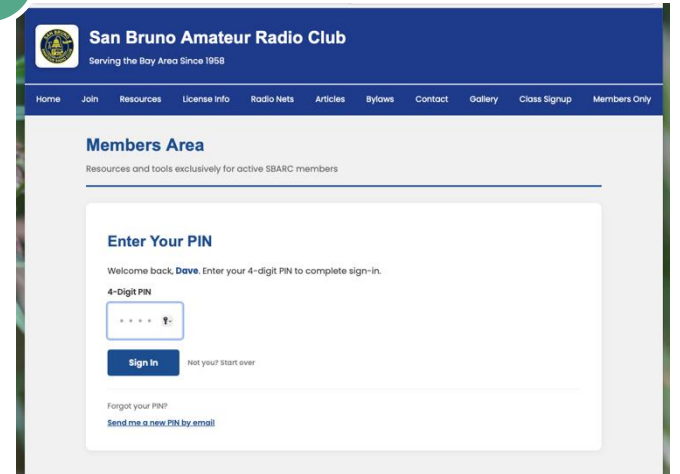

ARES & Special Service Club

Should SBARC add a formal emergency-communications role — and what it would take to get there.



What Is ARES?

Amateur Radio Emergency Service — ARRL's volunteer emcomm program

1

What it does

Trains and registers licensed hams to provide auxiliary communications for served agencies — county emergency services, hospitals, the Red Cross — before, during, and after disasters.

2

How it's organized

A Section Emergency Coordinator (SEC) oversees the ARRL section; District Emergency Coordinators (DECs) supervise regions; local Emergency Coordinators (ECs) run ARES day-to-day and register volunteers directly.

3

Not the same as RACES

RACES is the government-activated counterpart tied to civil defense/OES offices — more restrictive, and only activated by local government during declared emergencies.

Coastside (Coastside DEC)	Half Moon Bay ARES, La Honda ARES, South Skyline ARES	Half Moon Bay, La Honda, unincorporated Skyline / coastside communities
North County	None currently active	San Bruno, Millbrae, South San Francisco, Daly City, Colma, Brisbane, Pacifica

San Bruno, Millbrae, South San Francisco, Daly City, Colma, Brisbane, and Pacifica currently fall outside any active ARES Emergency Coordinator's jurisdiction.

The Opportunity for SBARC

Becoming North County's first formal ARES presence

A club member could be appointed Emergency Coordinator for San Bruno and neighboring cities through San Mateo County's Bayside DEC, Dr. David R. Richards (AF6MN) — giving the area a first-time, formal ARES presence with SBARC as the natural base for training nets, meetings, and volunteer recruitment.

1 Contact the Bayside DEC (Dr. David R. Richards, AF6MN) to discuss the coverage gap and the EC appointment process.

2 Identify one or more SBARC members willing to serve as Emergency Coordinator / Assistant EC for North County.

3 Define a proposed coverage boundary — San Bruno at minimum; potentially Millbrae, South San Francisco, Daly City, Colma, Brisbane.

4 Coordinate with South County ARES (SCARES) on boundaries and mutual-aid protocols to avoid overlap.

5 Register interested members using ARRL Form FSD-98 once an EC is appointed.

Getting Involved: Three ARES Training Levels

A personal Task Book tracks progress — the local EC signs off on each level

Level	Who It's For	Core Requirements	Outcome
Basic (Level 1)	New hams; anyone choosing a non-leadership role	FEMA IS-100 & IS-700, ARRL Basic EmComm Course, Technician license or higher	Ready for local, non-leadership ARES participation
Intermediate (Level 2)	Members deploying alongside served agencies, incl. outside the county	FEMA IS-100/200/700/800, ARRL Intermediate EmComm Course, quarterly net check-ins	Ready for served-agency deployments
Advanced (Level 3)	Members pursuing EC, AEC, DEC, SEC, or other leadership roles	9 additional FEMA IS courses, ARRL Advanced EmComm Course, serve as net control, teach a session	Qualified for ARES leadership and team-lead roles

General participants only need Level 1 to get started. A volunteer stepping into the Emergency Coordinator role would work toward Level 3.

ARRL Special Service Club Designation

Recognition for clubs that go above and beyond for their community and for Amateur Radio

1

Special recognition in QST when a club becomes or renews as an SSC.

2

Eligibility to appoint local ARRL Awards Managers.

3

A structured framework for growth — training, PR, EmComm, technical, and operating.

SBARC has been ARRL-affiliated since 1994 — the SSC prerequisite is already met. Our application has been submitted and is now with the Santa Clara Valley Section's Affiliated Club Coordinator for review.

The Six SSC Program Areas

Every application describes club activity across all six

New Ham Development & Training

Coordinated PR, recruiting, training, and follow-up for prospective and newly licensed hams.

Public Relations

Local media contact and coverage of club activities; a Public Information Officer.

Emergency Communications

Members ready to help during emergencies; Official Emergency Station appointment; ARES participation.

Technical Advancement

Ongoing technical education so members stay current; Technical Specialist appointment.

Operating Activities

Active participation in a major operating or operating-support activity.

Miscellaneous Activities

Whatever gives the club its own personality — three examples requested.
